1. Which are key quotes that our character says throughout the novel that encapsulates their values, motives, or in general, who they are?

2. List the physical traits of our character. What features would we show to portray him/her?

3. Are there particular items our character carried or felt an attachment to? Is there an object that was concealed in a pocket, held in hand, or worn on head or around neck, for example? Is there an object or two that possibly represents our character in some way?

4. What type of clothing did our character wear and did the clothing have meaning or impact the character's situation? Did our character change clothing or acquire something different at a certain point in the novel?

5. Is there a place that was important to our character? Or a place that was a turning point for the character or where something key occurred that impacted the character's future?

7. Does the meaning of our character's name have any significance?

8. Which colors are associated with our character's clothing, hair, complexion or mood?
